- Physical description** Red leather-bound manuscript with gold-leaf decorative borders and central tear-drop motif. On the lid of the box that holds the Quran there is a handwritten inscription that reads: 'This old Koran from upper Swat Valley was given by Lt. G. De Heries Smith A.D.C. to Sir W. Lochart - in 1898 to Lord Wolseley'.

<b>Physical description</b>	Egg-shaped vessel engraved with 'SL. Cope / XIX Regt' with 'GR' beneath a crown. The other side is engraved with a large diamond shape with a heart shape beneath, the letter 'A' and intricate floral patterns. The border is engraved: 'Cocoat Nut Tree is the Mother of Me'. There are two metal loops affixed to the sides of the vessel, and a metal mouthpiece with ivory stopper.

**Description** Flask, described as a 'toddy bottle used to carry daily liquor ration' by an unidentified soldier of the 19th Regiment, possibly during the Kandyan Wars, 1796-1818, Sri Lanka

**Physical description** Egg-shaped vessel, one side is engraved with floral patterns and the regimental number XIX. The other side is engraved with floral patterns, swirls and cross-hatching. There are two ivory loops affixed to either side of the vessel, and a metal mouthpiece with missing stopper.

<b>Physical description</b>	Knife with slightly curved metal blade decorated near to the hilt with ornate gold-work. The hilt is made of ornately carved ivory.

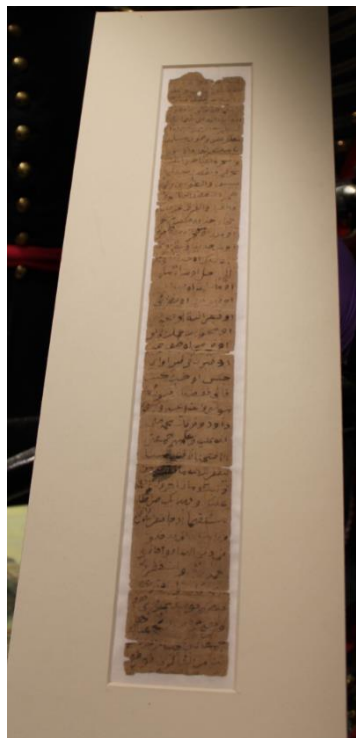
