Description	Silver bowl and plate said to have belonged to the Maharaja of Bharatpur, Balwant Singh, and described as being 'taken' after the Siege of Bharatpur in 1826 by Lieutenant John Fisher, Sirmoor Battalion, India
Physical description	Silver plate decorated on the edge and centre with floral patterns. The same pattern is repeated on the outer-edge and body of the bowl.
Names associated	Singh, Maharaja Balwant Fisher, Lieutenant John Sirmoor Battalion

Physical description	Fragment of shell with a handwritten inscription on paper that reads: 'Fragment of a shell fired by the mutineers into Hindu Rao's House... [indecipherable]'.

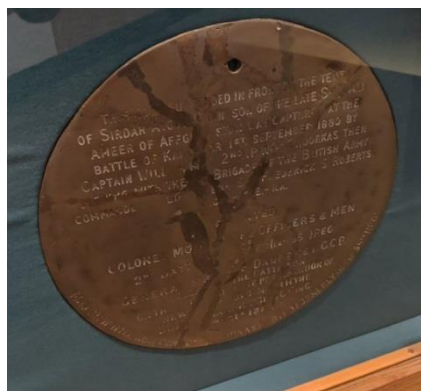

- Description** Gong, described as being 'suspended in front of the tent' of the Emir of Afghanistan Ghazi Mohammad Ayub Khan. Further described as being 'captured' by Captain William Hill, 2nd Gurkha Regiment at the Battle of Kandahar, 1 September 1880, during the Second Anglo-Afghan War, 1878-80, Afghanistan
- Physical description** Round metal gong with inscription (partially decipherable): 'This gong suspended in front of the tent of Sirdar Ayoub Khan son of the late ? Ameer of Affghanistan was captured at the Battle of Kandahar 1st September 1880 by Captain William Hill, 2nd (PWO) Ghoorkas then... with the... Brigade of the British Army commanded Frederick S. Roberts... Presented / Colonel M?... the officers & men 2nd Batt... (late 55) Regt / General... C.B. Daueney CCB... the battalion... presentation of... '.
