There are seven items from New Caledonia.

The earliest known acquisition was in 1880 from Miss McAusland, daughter of Captain George McAusland, who gave the museum two clubs of wood. One has a handle wrapped in trade cloth and braided flying fox fur. The other has a pointed head and a dark fibre cord around the grip and may originally be from Vanuatu.

There are two hair combs with multiple teeth and a sling of plant fibre from the late 19<sup>th</sup> century given by Captain William Murchie. The collection also includes a stone tool and a smoothly worked sling stone.
